## Hangar 101 Demolition









- Constructed in the 1950s and at the end of its useful life
- Vacant, no tenants
- Design of hangar demolition is underway (Funded by MnDOT Aeronautics)
- Concrete floor slab will remain in place
- Long term, the site will be available for future redevelopment



# Hangar 101 Demolition

#### Completed steps

- Regulated Materials Assessment Identification of regulated material removal needed during demolition (asbestos, etc.)
  - Regulated materials were identified throughout the structure
- ✓ Architectural history reconnaissance survey
  - The building was determined to be 'potentially eligible' for listing on the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP)
- ✓ Preliminary design
  - Survey, cost estimates, utility coordination







# Hangar 101 Demolition

#### • Next steps

□ Architectural history Intensive Survey (in progress)

- If structure is eligible for listing on NRHP
  - May need to complete an Environmental Assessment (EA) (6-9 months)
  - Mitigation (documentation) for loss of historical resource prior to demolition
- If structure is not eligible for listing on NRHP
  - May need to complete a Categorical Exclusion (CATEX) NEPA document
- □ Evaluate feasibility of wood beam reclamation
- Complete final design and finalize bidding strategy
- Bid project
- Complete removal project





# Hangar 101 Site Post Demolition

- Slab will be available for lease
- US Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) Formerly Used Defense Site (FUDS) project
  - USACE is finalizing an assessment of the property for potential and/or actual releases of contamination related to past DOD uses.
  - Assessment will determine projects recommended for further investigation or response action
  - Projects must then be added to USACE financial plan and budget
  - Decision Document identifying the remedial response action is estimated at 4.5 years from award of investigation contract (likely not prior to calendar year 2026)
  - USACE has indicated there may be some ability to accelerate schedule, but it is dependent upon many factors







### Hangar 101 Site Redevelopment (Long Term)
